- · play with their family and friends

















OTITIS MEDIA

- Otitis Media = <u>ALL</u> infections or swelling of the middle ear middle ear infection, tropical ear, swimmers ear, glue ear
- Usually associated with a build up of fluid in the middle ear the fluid may or may not be infected
- Can impact a child's hearing most common cause of hearing loss in young children
- · Children regularly suffer from Otitis Media
- Can impact a child's hearing at different times











CONDUCTIVE HEARING LOSS nearly always happens with Otitis Media

The ear is made up of three parts,

- outer ear
- middle ear
- inner ear
 - a conductive hearing loss happens when sounds cannot get through the outer ear and middle ear
 - it may be hard to hear soft sounds
 - louder sounds may be muffled





1 out of 10 children will start school with an undetected hearing loss!

Otitis Media – <u>ALL</u> infections or swelling of the middle ear – middle ear infection, tropical ear, swimmers ear, glue ear

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children...

- have the highest reported rates of Otitis Media and burst ear drums IN THE WORLD
- have Otitis Media from an earlier age and more often
- have Otitis Media that lasts longer and are often more severe
- can suffer long-term hearing loss
- often have impacts on learning outcomes due to hearing loss
