Heatley State School has a student dress code which has the full support and endorsement of the P and C and our school community. The dress code complies with the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006, Part 10, Sections 360-363.

All students are expected to wear the school uniform every day with pride. The student dress code is referred to in the Responsible Behaviour Plan for Students in accordance with the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006.

Every day uniform:

- navy and gold polo shirt with school emblem
- navy blue shorts/skort/culottes/netball skirt
- blue check cotton-collar and sleeves with navy/gold trim-emblem on pocket
- blue check dress-collar and sleeves with navy/gold trim-emblem on left side
- seniors shirts may be worn on any day
- sport house colour shirts may be worn on inter-house sport days
- in winter months students should wear plain jumpers, sloppy joes, track pants, leggings/tights that are in our school colours. Performance shorties should be worn under skirts and dresses where necessary for modesty.

Foot protection:

Preferably white socks and closed in shoes (preferably black or plain joggers or school shoes)

Hats:

Hats are a part of Heatley State School uniform. Students must wear a sun safe plain navy blue or school bucket hat (broad brimmed, bucket or legionnaire's style). School hats can be purchased from the Tuckshop. If the school hat is not worn, preferred hat colour is navy blue. From 2018 Heatley State School requires that all new enrolments wear the approved school hat. Peak caps will be phased out and all students will be required to wear bucket hats.

Students who do not have closed in shoes and/or a hat will be required to stay under a roofed area.

Jewellery

The following items are the ONLY jewellery permissible at school:

- a watch
- signet ring
- small plain (silver or gold) sleepers or studs

All jewellery must be removed during formal sporting activities e.g. netball, swimming, football soccer, hockey etc. This has been mandated by Workplace Health and Safety regulations.

Students wearing jewellery other than permissible items will be required to remove it immediately. This will include facial piercings other than in ears. Supporter bands and wristbands (other than the Gold Card band) are not permissible accessories for school. Such items will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the day.

Some students may be permitted to wear additional jewellery that is for religious, medical or cultural reasons ONLY after consultation with the Principal, safety will always be a primary consideration.

Dress Standard

It is expected that all students will have a neat and tidy appearance at all times.

Hairstyles should be tidy and appropriate for primary school children. Brightly coloured hair is not appropriate for school, and is not an accepted part of the dress code. Students with long hair are asked to tie it back to reduce the incidence of head lice infestation.

Make up, face glitter, coloured hair spray, zinc cream and nail polish are not permissible as part of the student dress code.

Inappropriate and unsafe garments including board shorts, singlets, tank tops, sleeveless tops, and imprinted items including logos or slogans and revealing garments are not permitted and students will be asked to change.

Undershirts or shorts which are visible while the uniform is being worn will be required to be removed.
